#### **DISCUSSION POINTS:**

- The Honnen Building, located in Commerce City has been partially vacated since the opening of the Human Services Center in 2017.
- Previous sale of the facility to the City of Commerce City was withdrawn by the City earlier in this calendar year.
- Facilities has reviewed options for potential disposition or renovation of the building and prepared a brief summary memorandum on these options and recommendations.

#### **DISCUSSION POINTS:**

- Adams County, in partnership with the Cities of Westminster and Federal Heights, began the Federal Boulevard Multimodal Transportation Study earlier this year. The study will identify multimodal transportation solutions along Federal Boulevard from 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Westminster to approximately 52<sup>nd</sup> Avenue at the City and County of Denver line.
- Staff and the consultant team will provide a review of the extensive planning efforts completed
  by various parties, including Adams County, that have been focused on this corridor. Staff will
  also provide an overview and update on the current study and the upcoming public outreach
  efforts.
- As part of the outreach plan, the consultant team, led by HDR, is interviewing key stakeholders from each jurisdiction including elected officials. The HDR team has prepared a series of questions to encourage discussion and receive feedback to a variety of issues facing all transportation modes along the Federal Boulevard corridor.
- In addition, the HDR team will answer questions related to how the study will engage the public despite restrictions currently in place due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### About the Project

- Partnership between Adams County, Federal Heights, and Westminster
- 52<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue (approx. 8 miles)
- Goal: "Create a community-serving boulevard by addressing the needs of the corridor as they relate to transportation, mobility, safety and accessibility."
- Two Phases
  - Phase I: Vision, Context, Critical Themes
  - Phase II: Identify and Fund Recommendations

- 2016 SW Adams Making Connections
- 2015 Building Healthy Corridors (ULI)
- 2015 Health Impact Assessment (TCHD)
- 2014 Federal Boulevard Framework Plan
- 2009 Clear Creek Valley Transit Oriented Plan
- 2005 SW Adams County Framework Plan



#### Overview of the Corridor

- High-speed, multi-lane corridor
  - US 287, CDOT-owned right-of-way
- Disconnected and/or missing sidewalk segments
- Virtually no bicycle infrastructure
- Transit service is present
  - RTD Route 31 serves the entire north-south corridor
  - A number of east-west routes cross the corridor
  - Two rail stations: Clear Creek/Federal station on the G Line;
     Westminster station on the B Line
  - Infrastructure lacking to access stops and stations

#### What's Happening Today

- Some minor improvements have been made recently
  - 2016, CDOT and Adams County, 52<sup>nd</sup> to 67<sup>th</sup>; medians, pedestrian countdown signals
  - 2019, Westminster, at 92<sup>nd</sup> Ave; turn lane improvement, ADA ramps
- Beginning to see new development
  - Transitioning from auto-oriented uses to transit-oriented development
  - Preservation of affordable housing
  - Redevelopment of brownfield sites
- RTD Regional BRT Study, 2019
- Improvements prioritized for future funding in NATA project list




#### What's Happening Today

- CDOT has programmed two projects in the near term
  - New signals and ADA ramp installation at US 36 (2020-2021)
  - Paving and some ADA ramp reconstruction/construction (2022)
- Study seeks to identify quick solutions to take advantage of DRCOG "Safer Main Streets" funding
  - Call for projects just opened
- Improvements anticipated with upcoming development
  - Clear Creek Transit Village Federal and 60<sup>th</sup>; PUD zoning;
     preliminary plat expected in August; final plat on two planning
     areas anticipated in the fall
