PURPOSE OF ITEM: Funding Discussion

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Amend current budget to allow funding from Airport Fund Balance

BACKGROUND:

Front Range Airport's landside pavements, inparticular the entry road and Terminal/FBO Parking, are at the point of failure due to a lack of funding source for rehabilitation. Funding for minor maintenance of these pavements has typically come from the the operating/maintenance cost center within the FRA Fund and is used for crack sealing and minimal asphalt patching. These maintenance projects have been accomplished using airport staff and equipment.

Front Range groundside pavements were originally constructed in the 1984-1987 time frames, and have not received major rehabilitation since then. Engineers state that asphalt pavements should receive a surface treatment every 4-5 years for the life of the pavement, along with yearly crack sealing. Typical lifespan for asphalt pavements is 10-20 years depending on traffic.

Airport groundside pavement status:

- 1. Front Range Parkway. (Proposed 2015 project)
 - a. Constructed in 1984. This section of pavement can be rehabilitated with major crack repair, minimal full depth patching, and a two inch asphalt overlay.
 - b. Estimated cost \$120,000
- 2. Air Traffic Control Tower parking lot. (Proposed 2015 project)
 - a. New construction.
 - b. Estimated cost \$30,000 for a four inch pavement section.

Front Range has identified partial funding for these projects from redesign of other planned projects. Restructuring of other 2015 projects will make available \$55,000 to be used toward these asphalt projects leaving a need for \$95,000 amendment to the current budget to fund the project from the Airport Fund Balance. A total of \$150,000 is needed for the two proposed 2015 projects, We have identified the \$55,000 mentioned above from existing appropriation to help cover this cost, but are in need of an

additional \$95,000 to fully fund the two projects. The basis for the request is that we would like to utilize a portion of the existing \$1.2 million in FRA fund balance to appropriate the additional \$95,000 needed.

Completion of this project during this year would allow Front Range to take possible advantage of other paving projects that are scheduled on roadways adjacent to the airport and benefit from economies of scale.

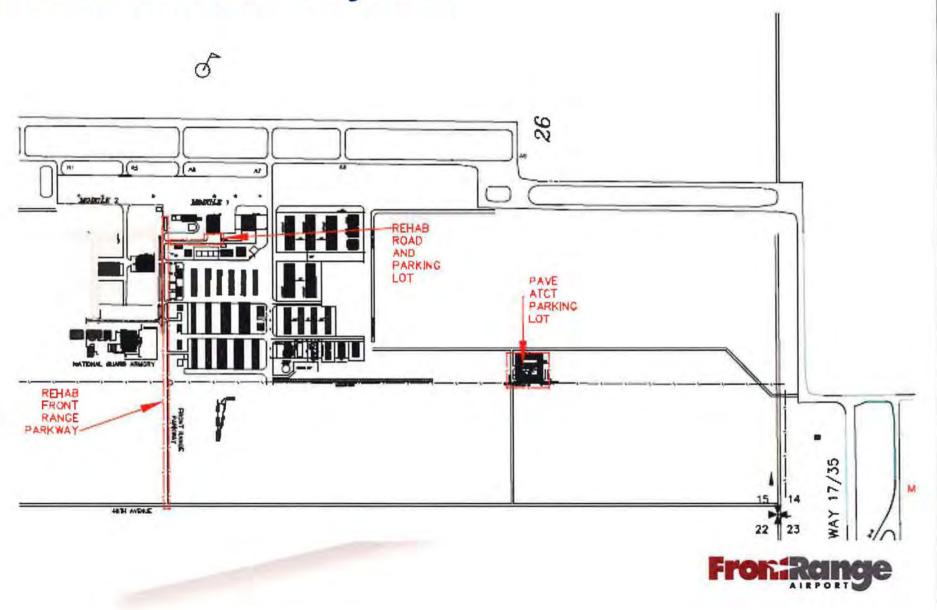


Proposed Asphalt Projects

Background

Front Range Parkway Entry Road and Terminal/FBO Parking Lot:

- Originally constructed 1984-1987
- No major rehabilitation since
- Annual patching, crack sealing, and maintenance performed by Airport staff, but insufficient to maintain to desired level (current Pavement Condition Index is 35 vs. desired minimum of 72)
- Asphalt pavements should receive surface treatment every 4-5 years for life of pavement along with yearly crack sealing
- Typical lifespan for asphalt pavements is 10-20 years depending on traffic
- At the point of failure due to previous lack of funding for rehabilitation
- Funding for minor maintenance of these pavements has come from operating/maintenance cost center within the FRA Fund











Background

ATCT Parking Area

- Dirt lot becomes muddy and rutted when wet
- Difficult to plow during snow events
- Airport staff spends 20+ man hours per year repairing lot after rain and snow storms
- Results in 40+ additional hours of cleaning and upkeep due to mud being tracked into the Tower







2015 Proposed Asphalt Projects

- Front Range Parkway Entry Road and Terminal/FBO Parking Lot
 - Major crack repair
 - Minimal full depth patching
 - Two inch asphalt overlay
 - Estimated cost \$120,000
- Air Traffic Control Tower parking lot
 - New construction
 - Estimated cost \$30,000 for a four inch pavement section
- Total estimated cost of both projects = \$150,000

Options:

- 1. Do nothing leave as is
 - Not recommended due to further deterioration and increasing maintenance and repair costs
- 2. Wait until 2016 to complete project
 - Not recommended due to further deterioration and increasing maintenance and repair costs
 - Cost may increase due to current economies of scale from other projects in the area
- 3. Complete project in 2015
 - Recommended
 - Entry road pavement well beyond useful life and too far gone in many areas to patch
 - Relatively small financial impact
 - Will reduce maintenance and repair costs
 - Quick win to help improve airport image (high visibility)
 - Brings pavement up to Adams County's pavement standards



Funding

Rather than replacing the Maintenance Building roof for \$80,000 as originally budgeted in 2015, three independent contractors recommended making a smaller repair to extend the life of the roof by 7-10 years. This repair was done for \$10,000, which left a remaining balance of \$70,000 in the roof replacement budget. Of this, \$15,000 was used for fuel truck repairs. The now remaining balance of \$55,000 can be used to partially cover the cost of the proposed asphalt projects.

Estimated cost of asphalt projects: \$150,000

Funds available within existing 2015 budget: \$55,000

Balance needed to complete project in 2015: \$95,000

Staff recommends utilizing a portion of the existing \$1.2 million Front Range Airport Fund fund balance to cover the additional \$95,000 needed to complete these projects in 2015.
