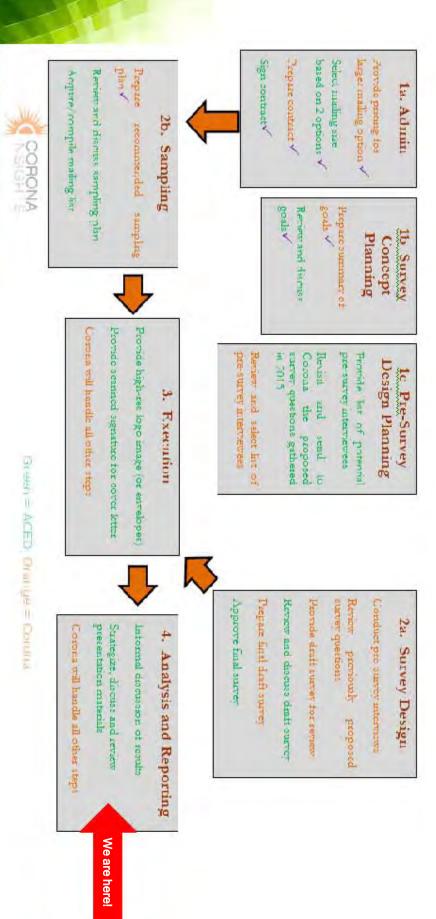

SUBJECT: Amendments to the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations

PURPOSE OF ITEM: To provide a work plan and prioritization for amendments to the County's Development Standards and Regulations and seek direction from the Board of County Commissioners

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Approval of the proposed work plan

BACKGROUND:

In previous study sessions, the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) has provided direction to staff to review the County's Development Standards and Regulations and make recommendations for amendments. Some of the specific policies that the BoCC directed staff to review include current landscape requirements, agricultural support uses and regulations, regional traffic impact fees, and potential conflicts within the Development Standards and Regulations. When Adams County adopted new oil and gas regulations, the BOCC directed staff to commence a study of the traffic impact fees associated with oil and gas development. In partnership with the Transportation Department, this project will include such a study related to all development related traffic impacts, including oil and gas development.

Certain sections of the County's Development Standards and Regulations also need to be updated to reflect changes in the functions of departments, specifically relating to administration of the County's development regulations. A few identified policies in the Development Standards and Regulations have also not been fully administered to serve the ultimate purpose for which such regulations were enacted; this is due to ambiguity of interpretations. A number of sections in the Development Standards and Regulations are also outdated and need to be revised to keep current with trends and the development needs of the County.

The Study Session presentation will provide an outline of the proposed work plan and an update of current work, including the project scope and the portions of the workplan to be prepared by an outside consultant.
